The Story of the Izzy Doll

An Izzy Doll is a small, handmade doll that has become a symbol of Canadian peacekeeping and humanitarian work. It was inspired by Master Corporal Mark "Izzy" Isfeld, a <u>Canadian Military Engineer</u> who lost his life while clearing landmines in Croatia.

Mark often carried these dolls, made by his mother Carol, to distribute to children in war-torn areas. The dolls brought comfort and joy to children who had experienced trauma and loss.

The Izzy Doll initiative continues today, with volunteers (like you!) knitting and crocheting dolls to be sent to children in need around the world. They are a powerful symbol of compassion and hope.

Get Creative!

Izzy Dolls must all resemble humans. Their "clothing" comes in all styles and colours and creativity is encouraged! Long hair, short hair, braided hair, no hair, skirts, dresses, shirts, pants, hats, bonnets, or the traditional UN blue beret and soldier uniform are all welcome!

Please vary the skin tones used. Note that only natural coloured skin tones such as light, medium or dark brown, black, or, white, cream, pink are acceptable. Izzy Dolls are sent to a variety of different locations across the globe and our goal is for the children to feel that the Izzy Dolls represent them well.

Materials Required

- Synthetic yarn should be used to prevent shrinking. Light Worsted (3) or Double Knitting (DK) works best.
 - Colour A (skin tone remember to vary skin tones),
 Colour B (body colour), Colour C (leg colour), Colour D
 (black/blue for shoes), Colour E (red/pink for mouth).
- Crochet hooks in sizes G (4mm) & size E (3.5 mm).
- Place markers (PM) to mark stitches.
- ☐ Yarn needle for sewing parts together.
- Synthetic batting or stuffing.

Did You Know?

Izzy dolls are designed to be transported by Canadian soldiers in the pockets of their uniforms. Please do not use any plastic buttons or metallic pieces as they could become choking hazards. They must be lightweight and the overall size of completed Izzy Dolls should be 13 to 16 cm (5 to 6 inches) in height.

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Head / Upper Body

- Colour A (skin tone), ch 3. Sl st in first stitch to form ring.
 Rnd 1: 6 sc in ring. Do not join in round. Place marker (PM) in last st to mark end of round.
 Continue moving PM at the end of each round
- ☐ **Rnd 2**: 2 sc in each sc around. (12 sc).

throughout pattern steps.

- Rnd 3: * 2 sc in next sc. sc in next sc.
 Rep from * around. (18 sc)
- Rnd 4: * 2 sc in next sc. sc in each of next 2 sc.

 Rep from * around. (24 sc)
- Rnd 5: * 2 sc in next sc. sc in each of next 3 sc.

 Rep from * around. (30 sc)
- **☐** *Rnd* 6-10: *sc* in each *sc* around.
- □ Rnd 11: * Draw loop through each of next 2 sc. Draw yarn through all 3 loops on hook - 2 sc together made. sc in each of next 3 sc. Rep from * around. (24 sc)
- ☐ **Rnd 12**: Sc2tog 6 times around. (12 sc)
- ☐ **Rnd 13-14**: sc in each sc around.
- Rnd 15: Join Colour B (body colour). 2 sc in each sc around. (24 sc)
- Rnd 16: * 2 sc in next sc. sc in each of next 3 sc.

 Rep from * around. (30 sc)
- Rnd 17: * 2 sc in next sc. sc in each of next 4 sc.

 Rep from * around. (36 sc)
- Rnd 18: * 2 sc in next sc. sc in each of next 5 sc. Rep from * around. (42 sc)
- Rnd 19: sc in next 5 sc. Insert hook in next sc. Count 9 sc from this sc and insert hook in 9th sc. Sl st together. Smaller round for arm now made.
- When you finish Row 19, start the arms. Row 19 is the base for the right arm.

Right Arm

- ☐ Colour B (body colour)
- ☐ **Rnd 1**: Ch 1. sc in same sc. sc in each of next 10 sc. (12 sc) PM
- Rnd 2-5: sc in each sc around.
- Rnd 6: Join Colour A (skin tone). sc in each sc around. (12 sc)
- Rnd 7: * Sc2tog. sc in next sc.
 Rep from * around
- ☐ **Rnd 8 to end**: Sc2tog to sc remaining.
- ☐ Fasten off.
- ☐ Draw yarn snugly through middle.

Left Arm

- ☐ Colour B (body colour)
- □ Rnd 1: Count 5 sc to the right of the marker. Insert hook in 6th sc. Count back to 10th sc and insert hook. Sl st together. PM.
- **☐** *Rnd* **2-5**: 1 *sc* in each *sc* around.
- Rnd 6: Join Colour A (skin tone). 1 sc in each sc around. (12 sc)
- Rnd 7: * Sc2tog. 1 sc in next sc. Rep from * around
- ☐ **Rnd 8 to end**: Sc2tog to 1 sc remaining.
- ☐ Fasten off.
- Stuff head, arms and this portion of upper body.

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Body

- ☐ Colour B (body colour)
- ☐ With marker side facing, insert hook in the 6th sc to right of marker.
- Rnd 1: Ch 1, sc in same st. Sc in each of next 11 sc. 2 sc in arm joint sc. Sc in each of next 11 sc. (26 sc) PM
- **☐** *Rnd* **2-5**: *sc* in 26 *sc* around.
- ☐ **Rnd 6-8**: Join Colour C (leg colour). *sc* in each of 26 *sc*.
- Stuff body.

Left Leg

- ☐ Colour C (leg colour)
- Sc in next 6 sc. Insert hook in 7th sc. Count to 13th sc. Insert hook in 13th sc. Sl st together ch
 (Counts as 1st sc.) Smaller round for leg now made. (13 sc) PM
- Rnd 1-7: sc in each sc around.
- Rnd 8: Join Colour D (shoe colour). sc in each sc around.
- ☐ *Rnd* 9-11: *sc* in each *sc* around.
- ☐ **Rnd 12**: Sc2tog in each sc around to last sc. sc in last sc.
- Cut yarn leaving tail to sew seam.
- Stuff leg.
- Sew seam.

Right Leg

- ☐ Colour C (leg colour)
- ☐ Insert hook in same sc as first sc of Left Leg. Sl st together. Ch 1. (Counts as 1st sc.) sc in each of next 12 sc. (13 sc) PM
- Rnd 1-7: sc in each sc around. Sl st in next 2 sc. PM
- ☐ Rnd 8: Join Colour D (shoe colour). sc in each sc around.
- ☐ **Rnd 9-11**: sc in each sc around.
- Rnd 12: Sc2tog in each sc around to last sc. sc in last sc.
- Cut yarn leaving tail to sew seam.
- Stuff leg.
- Sew seam.



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Hat

- □ Colour B (body colour or complimentary colour), *ch* 3. *Sl st* in first stitch to form ring.
- Rnd 1: 6 sc in ring. Do not join in round. Place marker (PM) in last st to mark end of round. Continue moving PM at the end of each round throughout pattern steps.
- ☐ **Rnd 2**: 2 sc in each sc around. (12 sc).
- Rnd 3: * 2 sc in next sc. 1 sc in next sc.
 Rep from * around. (18 sc)
- Rnd 4: * 2 sc in next sc. 1 sc in each of next 2 sc.

 Rep from * around. (24 sc)
- Rnd 5: * 2 sc in next sc. 1 sc in each of next 3 sc.

 Rep from * around. (30 sc)
- **☐** *Rnd* 6-7: 1 *sc* in each *sc* around.
- □ Rnd 8: Join Colour C (leg colour or complimentary trim colour). 1 sc in each sc around. Sl st in next sc.
- Fasten off.
- Sew onto head.
- ☐ **Rnd 8 Girl Doll Option**: This will create a scalloped trim to the Cap. * 3 hdc in first sc. Sl st in next sc. Rep from * to end.
- ☐ Rnd 8 Peaked Cap Option: Insert hook in any sc. Ch 1, sc in next 8 sc. * Turn. Sc2tog, sc to last 2 sc, sc2tog. Rep from * 3 times.

Beret

- ☐ Colour F (United Nations blue), *ch* 3. *Sl st* in first stitch to form ring.
- □ Rnd 1: 6 sc in ring. Do not join in round. Place marker (PM) in last st to mark end of round. Continue moving PM at the end of each round throughout pattern steps.
- **Rnd 2**: 2 sc in each sc around. (12 sc).
- ☐ Rnd 3: * 2 sc in next sc. 1 sc in next sc.

 Rep from * around. (18 sc)
- Rnd 4: * 2 sc in next sc. 1 sc in each of next 2 sc. Rep from * around. (24 sc)
- Rnd 5: * 2 sc in next sc. 1 sc in each of next 3 sc. Rep from * around. (30 sc)
- Rnd 6: * 2 sc in next sc. 1 sc in each of next 4 sc. Rep from * around. (36 sc)
- Rnd 7: * 2 sc in next sc. 1 sc in each of next 5 sc. Rep from * around. (42 sc)
- ☐ **Rnd 8**: 1 sc in back loop only in each sc
- ☐ **Rnd 9**: * Sc2tog, 1 sc in next 5 sc. Rep from * to end. (36 sc)
- ☐ **Rnd 10**:* Sc2tog, 1 sc in next 4 sc. Rep from * to end. (30 sc)
- ☐ **Rnd 11**: Join Colour D (black or contrasting colour for trim). 1 sc in each sc around.

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Girl Doll

- ☐ Colour A (skin tone), *ch* 3. *Sl st* in first stitch to form ring.
- Rnd 1: 6 sc in ring. Do not join in round. Place marker in last st to mark end of round.
 Continue moving marker at the end of each round throughout pattern steps.
- ☐ **Rnd 2**: 2 sc in each sc around. (12 sc).
- Rnd 3: * 2 sc in next sc. 1 sc in next sc.
 Rep from * around. (18 sc)
- Rnd 4: * 2 sc in next sc. 1 sc in each of next 2 sc.

 Rep from * around. (24 sc)
- Rnd 5: * 2 sc in next sc. 1 sc in each of next 3 sc.

 Rep from * around. (30 sc)
- ☐ **Rnd** 6-8: Continuing with Colour B (body colour) 1 sc in each of 30 sc around.
- ☐ **Rnd 9**: Change to size E hook. Continue pattern from first round of LEFT LEG to end of RIGHT LEG instructions.



Skirt

- □ Colour G (skirt colour), *ch* 27 *sc*. Join to form round. (26 *sc*)
- Rnd 1: 2 sc in next sc. 1 sc in each of next 2 sc.

 Rep from * around ending with 2 sc.
- Rnd 2-5: (you can choose to make more rounds depending on the length you want to make the skirt) 1 sc in each sc around.
- ☐ Rnd 6: Join Colour H (trim colour or complimentary colour) * 3 hdc in next sc. 1 sc in next sc. Rep from * to end. Sl st in next sc.
- □ Fasten off.
- Weave in ends.
- ☐ Slide skirt onto body.
- ☐ Sew in place at waistline.

Hair / Finishing

- ☐ Cut 18 pieces of wool in 26 cm (10 inch) lengths.
- Fold each strand of yarn in half.
- □ Locate the approximate centre line of the head from front to back. Starting just above the hairline, insert hook and draw through folded strand of yarn to form a small loop. Pull through the 2 dangling strands and pull snugly. Continue along centre line in this manner. Separate 18 strands to each side.
- Leave hair long, create pigtails or ponytails.
- If also adding a hat, sew hat on the head.
- ☐ Trim hair to desired length.
- Embroider face details.

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
